# SECURITY ISSUE

# Problem

During the last few weeks there have been several instances of locks left open:

- ⇒ Clubhouse
  - the basement door wide open
  - the main front door unlocked

- ⇒ Compound gate swinging wide,
  - lock left with combination showing
  - lock loosely on gate but not secured
- ⇒ other facilities
  - exterior storage shed unlocked and open

#### Risk

- ⇒ The Clubhouse is full of valuable equipment (not to mention YOUR valuables).
- ⇒ We're in a very high pedestrian traffic area.

#### Solutions

- ⇒ Treat the Clubhouse as your house:
  - lock it.
    - When leaving the Clubhouse,
    - lock the door.
    - if no one else if visible to the door, treat it as your responsibility and lock the door.
    - If you're not the last person out, "tag" someone else with the responsibility, "please see that the door is locked when you leave."
    - When you close the door, make sure it has latched shut.
- ⇒ Always check the doors and gates if you are part of a group of people and tell others that you checked the door and or gate. This will serve as an ongoing reminder to lock the door as well as get it locked.

- ⇒ Treat the compound as your personal storage area:
  - lock it.
    - For combination locks that open and shut by rolling the tumblers, roll the tumblers so that others don't see the combination. This works if leaving the lock open and after you lock it. TEST the lock before leaving.
    - For padlocks, etc., make sure you don't leave them lying around after you remove them. Locks have been known to walk away.
- ⇒ Finally, DO NOT give out the combinations. VCKC members can access this information by logging on to the website.

#### Canoe Courses

#### Ocean Canoeing Course

This course is being offered to canoeists who have taken and passed the basic tandem canoeing course. It consists of 12 hours of classroom teaching, covering tides and currents, weather, navigation and charts, etc., and a 3-day canoe camping trip over the weekend of 11th/12th May. The fee of \$100 goes to the Club. Additional costs include the purchase of charts and tide and current tables -

probably around \$40 in total- and any costs associated with the tripping - transportation and campsite fees.

#### Big Canoe Sterners Course

There will be an RCABC Big Canoe Sterner's Course on April 20th/21st. This course is intended to train paddlers to stern big canoes. Pre-requisites are basic and advanced canoe tandem course and the basic canoe solo course, plus experience of paddling in the voyageur canoes. Alternative qualifications and experience will be considered for paddlers who may

not have all the formal courses. The course includes a rescue session in the Gorge.

#### Course Details

Recreational Canoeing Association of BC (RCABC) paddler-level courses are offered annually by qualified club instructors. Fees for these courses go

to the Club, not the instructor. Club membership is required to attend these courses. Membership are \$50 for an individual and \$70 for a family.

#### Lakewater:

Basic Lakewater I tandem course is an introduction to canoeing and a prerequisite for all further courses; the course runs a full day. You will learn everything from basic knots, to safe carrying and transporting of a canoe, to what to wear on the water, to all the basic canoe strokes, to a canoe

rescue strategy. Lakewater II is the basic solopaddling course. Lake Water III and IV are the advanced Lakewater courses for tandem techniques and solo paddling skill development.

There may be a small additional fee to cover the cost of pool rental for the rescue portion.

#### Moving Water:

Moving Water I is the basic tandem river paddling course; Moving Water II is the introductory course for solo canoeing on rivers. You will learn all the basics for river paddling, such as reading water, ferrying across current, eddy turns and you will do a rescue in current.

#### Ocean/Coastal Canoeing:

There are 2 courses, basic and advanced. The basic course introduces the students to ocean paddling, including reading tides and currents, navigating with a compass, and the use of tide and current tables and charts. The advanced course includes ocean canoeing with camping, usually a trip among the Gulf Islands.

#### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT**

#### **Executive Priorities for 2013**

At its meeting of March 12th, the Executive agreed to pursue the following objectives in 2013, listed in order of priority:

- 1. Update Programs' 3-year plans
- 2. Discuss program health recruitment; coaches, instructors, and specialized personnel; competition analysis; promotion of Club programs
- Continue work on the upgrade of storage facilities; discuss storage needs and update policies
- 4. Ensure cross-program fairness
- 5. Develop the 2014 budget
- 6. [TIE] Education of members e.g., through general meetings, program training initiatives, etc.
  - AND Continue to work on a long-term (10-year horizon) plan for capital equipment renewal
- 7. Clarify the purpose of contingency funds

# Program 3-Year Plans and Funding Principles

Programs have been given their marching orders to revisit and update their rolling 3-year plans by June. The first big equipment purchase of the year, a new voyageur canoe, was launched on March 16<sup>th</sup> (see story on page 8 in the Newsletter). The set of

funding principles adopted last year had one new item added to it: "VCKC makes special efforts to recruit and train youth paddlers." This led to an interesting discussion about the success of those efforts over the years.

## Program Health

The Committee had another interesting discussion about how to identify which programs are "healthy". It was acknowledged that program health can fluctuate from year to year, owing to a combination of factors including program leadership, enthusiasm of members, ability to attract and retain members, the level of coaching/instruction, availability of specialized personnel such as sterns and coaches, a welcoming attitude, general level of boat usage, inter-disciplinary cooperation and mentorship. The overall health of the Club can also be distinguished

from program health, and may be dependent upon effective communication with the public and its ability to obtain and process feedback from its members. A healthy Club is one in which people have fun and are happy to volunteer their services. Members suggested that an Open House or VCKC Regatta held during the summer might be a way of drawing the public's attention. The brainstorming will continue; but program directors are now attuned to gauging program health when they look at their yearly plans.

## Executive Committee Report, cont'd

#### VCKC and Youth Paddlers

You don't have to be around VCKC activities or practices for very long to realize that participation definitely skews to the over-40 crowd. The Club has recently been working with Craigflower School and will begin a partnership with Shoreline School to get more youngsters into boats. However, getting and keeping young paddlers may be an uphill battle. In trying to analyze the reasons, the Committee identified the following:

- There is a steep price barrier for young people, particularly in the small-boat disciplines: gear, appropriate clothing and transportation can all be well beyond the means of teens and twentysomethings, especially those without a vehicle.
- Many young people tend to like spontaneous activities and dislike regimentation.

- The Club may not be tech-savvy enough to reach out to young people.
- Maybe we don't offer an attractive blend of activities; e.g., stand-up paddle-boarding might be a bigger draw.
- The fact that we cannot pay staff may mean that we're missing opportunities for local municipalities to use our boats for summer programs.
- The participation of parents often ensures their sons' or daughters' participation.
- Too many gray hairs around?? Would you want to belong to the same club as your granny?
