#### **MEMBERSHIP 2020**

Membership renewal for 2020 is fast approaching. Current memberships will expire December 31<sup>st</sup> and can be renewed during the month of December. A reminder will be sent if the membership has not been renewed and will be termed "lapsed" after a short period.

Only online renewals will be accepted prior to the AGM. If paying by cash or cheque it will need to be done at the Clubhouse the evening of the AGM in order to be eligible to vote. Volunteers will be on hand one hour prior to the AGM start. A fee increase is recommended for 2020 for ratification at the AGM. If you renew before the AGM, then it will be at the 2019 fee.

Please login to your profile at <a href="www.vckc.ca">www.vckc.ca</a> using your email and password and verify that the information provided is correct and then renew your membership. Those who are designated as Family Administrators, renewal will include yourself and all your family members.

After a membership has lapsed, members can still renew as described above. **Family Administrators** must renew not only their membership but complete the process for **ALL** family members individually.

A number of Family Administrators who renewed their memberships after they had lapsed, will find that their family members are still lapsed and are no longer counted as members for the current year.

Dear VCKC Members.

This is a call for nominations to the club's 2020 Executive! All positions are open for nomination and are elected by the membership for a one-year term. Elections take place at the club's Annual General Meeting on January

14, 2020. The meeting will start at 7:30 pm and held at the VCKC clubhouse (355 Gorge Road W.)

Most of the 2019 Executive members are choosing to stay on for 2020, but all positions are open for election and are subject to member approval at the AGM.

At this time, we are in particular need for member volunteers to stand for nomination for the positions of:

- -<u>House & Grounds Director</u>: This person will be in charge of the day-to-day management of the clubhouse facility, organizes clubhouse cleanup events twice per year, coordinates contractors and repairs, and the associated budget. This is an excellent role for anyone who loves old heritage houses and takes pride in managing our leased property on the Gorge. We are looking to make some improvements to the clubhouse over the next couple of years.
- -<u>Safety & Standards Director:</u> This is a position for a technical expert with a strong background in policies and best practices for on-water safety. This is an ideal position for an experienced program leader, preferably with credentials and training in the range of programs we offer.
- -<u>Director at Large:</u> This is a general position for our members who want to be more involved in the directions, decisions, and program development at the club. The purpose of the position is to offer an introductory role for new club leaders, and to be a back-up resource in the event other Directors cannot complete their term.



#### Sunday November 24, 2019 Flatwater Paddle

How did it come to be that Telegraph Cove is found the end of Telegraph Bay Road? And what's the difference between a bay and a cove anyways? Well, the quandary quickly came to pass as we unloaded 6 kayaks from our cars and launched into an inviting sea state.

The conditions were fantastic. The strong west winds in the Juan de Fuca had little presence during our excursion. It was smooth paddling with just a hint of flood current pushing us north. Lots to explore along this route. Home to lottery winners, small caves, and numerous lurking rocks

If you paddle near Purnima you get exposed to some fine water fowl identification skills. She pointed out various ducks: Harlequins, two types of Mergansers, and Buffleheads. And a single seagull in the middle of them all looking a bit out of place. Herons too. And, a family of river otters perched on a rock bluff who weren't too pleased with our encroachment - they scrambled further up the bluff and disappeared into a small cabin.

In paddle conditions like today time goes by quickly and it didn't take long before our lunch destination was upon us - Glencoe Cove. It was only 11am so we decided to explore further to the north. We continued to noodle along the shoreline revelling in the day's warmth, almost to Cormorant point, then back to the sun exposed Glencoe Cove for lunch

We retraced our route back to reach our launch around 2pm. Back to the clubhouse to rinse and stow the club boats.

Our travel distance is a bit uncertain. My phone tracker suggested 11.5km was paddled. Craig's more trustworthy Garmin unit indicated around 10km. Purnima's technology called out 12km and a bit.

Lastly, props to Ken who was out on his first day trip following the basic kayak course a few weeks earlier.

#### **Boat Storage Newsletter Report**

We're done! The new boat storage sheds are completed. Over the winter and spring, we were able to get all the construction and funding approvals needed from Saanich. After taking the summer off, a construction team was assembled, plans finalized, materials ordered, and construction completed over a 6 week period. We began demolition of the old canoe racks on October 10th and finished building the new shed on Nov 21st.

Lots of people to thank: Tim Marks designed the structures and drew up the plans. Tom Staebell negotiated a discounted price for the construction supplies from Slegg Lumber. Mark Sondheim managed



the money. Joe Boyd, Mark S. and Tim M. coordinated our discussions with Saanich. Tim M., Tom S., Ray Milan, Ron Williams, David Kilshaw and Dan Walker formed the construction team. The plan was a revision of a 2018 renovation plan submitted to Saanich by Tim, Joe, Mark and Arthur Caldicott. Finally, many Club members offered encouragement and even coffee and cookies.

Over the next month, we'll be re-constructing the basement storage racks to improve storage efficiency and opening up some of the basement now used for boat storage for general Club use. We also plan to build a Paddleboard rack for the new SUP's the Club will be purchasing in the Spring

The BC Marine Trails Network Association (also known as BC Marine Trails) is a BC-based registered non-profit society and a registered charity under the Canada Income Tax Act dedicated to both creating and preserving a network of BC coastal marine

launch points and public recreation sites and to the protection of the environment through our environmental stewardship practices. As written in the 'History of the BCMTNA' major progress began on this initiative in 2007. The success of the BCMT to date rests with hard-working volunteers and dialogue and consultation with First Nations (rights holders), stakeholder groups and government agencies.

At the heart of the Association is our Board and committees. Their roles and responsibilities have become complex and far-reaching. Given the length of the BC coastline — estimated to be around 27 000 km long — and the huge number of actual and potential sites, there is a significant amount of work yet to be done. Our three committees -

Trails Development, Stewardship and Communications - are well organized to understand complex areas of responsibilities.

VCKC is one of 12 paddling clubs from Vancouver Island, Salt Spring Island and the mainland of BC providing support to BC Marine Trails. Each club assigns designated representatives to liaise and volunteer with the BCMT.

As I will no longer be a member of VCKC, BC Marine Trails will <u>need a new VCKC club representative</u> for 2020. If you are interested, please contact <u>karen@bcmarinetrails.org</u>
